About the Role

The post holders will be part of the thriving Research Centre for Arts and Wellbeing at Edge Hill University working on a UKRI funded study, following on from extensive research on the Arts for the Blues project and related research activities.

This study aims to generate new, scalable evidence concerning:

- (A) how to access arts activities that best support the mental health of children and young people.
- (B) how to evaluate arts activities that meet the diverse mental health needs of children and young people.
- (C) how to maximise the benefit of arts activities for as many children and young people as possible.

The project will involve the use of a digital platform where evidence-based local arts activities will become easily accessible for children and young people, their families, relevant organisations and services.

The Creative Health Associates will be seconded to a community organisation working closely with the research team on the one hand and children, young people and their families on the other to help with co-producing the content of this platform that will enable access to place-based arts initiatives. Whilst based in a community organisation, they will liaise with NHS trusts, schools and community organisations encouraging collaboration within and across systems, enabling the development and testing of an agreed evaluation framework of best practice in arts activities including arts and health and arts therapies projects and services. They will work closely with the local community, engaging in mapping exercises, evaluation and training.

Duties and Responsibilities

The post holder will be expected to:

- a) Data collection: assist research team with data collection employing relevant research methods guided by the PI and the postgraduate research fellow relevant to the local organisations in their locality.
- b) Data processing and analysis: support the team with analysing specific data sets as requested and guided by the PI and postdoctoral research fellow.
- c) Presentation of results. Contribute to the presentation of results of research to internal groups/PI. Draft reports through appropriate word processing and data presentation software.





- d) Literature searches. To undertake scoping surveys of bibliographic databases and literature search engines informed by up-to-date information on related research. Develop an understanding of a range of literature and gaps in literature.
- e) Project administration. Some administration of projects under the supervision of the line manager, with responsibility for own areas of the project. Seek guidance when appropriate from PI and the postdoctoral research fellow.
- f) Attending and contributing to research team meetings.
- g) Become an active member of organisation they are seconded to.
- h) Initiating and, where appropriate, lead internal networks to facilitate collaborative decision-making, fostering engagement to the project's activities.
- i) Adherence to the University's research governance framework.
- j) Contributing to the production of bids for research funding.
- k) Provision of support for consultancy, research and evaluation activities, and the public engagement events.
- a) To make a positive contribution to activities of the Research Centre for Arts and Wellbeing.

In addition to the above all Edge Hill University staff are required to:

- a) Adhere to all Edge Hill's policies and procedures, including Equality and Diversity and Health and Safety.
- b) Respect confidentiality: all confidential information should be kept in confidence and not released to unauthorised persons.
- c) Undertake appropriate learning and development activities as required.
