About the Role

Graduate Teaching Assistants hold a unique position in the University, being both registered postgraduate researchers (PGRs) undertaking a full-time PhD in the Graduate School and carrying out teaching/teaching support duties. PGRs with a GTA studentship will be expected to:

- Complete a programme of researcher development.
- Undertake tailored continuing researcher development.
- Complete a programme of training in teaching in Higher Education.
- Complete a PhD programme of research under the guidance of an appointed supervisory team.
- Undertake up to six hours teaching a week as directed by the Head of Department.
- Undertake up to nine hours per week of marking and preparation.
- Enhance the research culture of the department in which they are located, and of the University as a whole, by participating in development activities including publication and presenting at conferences.

The successful candidates will be allocated a mentor from the permanent teaching staff in respect of their teaching responsibilities, and a supervisory team of at least two suitably qualified members of Edge Hill University.

About Us

Edge Hill University is an ambitious institution, based on an attractive, award-winning 160-acre campus in Lancashire, close to Liverpool and Manchester. The University aspires to combine excellent research of reach and significance with a world-class student experience.

Edge Hill University was named Modern University of the Year in the Times and Sunday Times Good University Guide 2022 and shortlisted for the overall UK University of the Year award. With this award the University was called 'one of the shining stars of the modern university sector.' The award has come closely after Edge Hill was awarded University of the Year in the Educate North Awards 2020/21.

Edge Hill University appears in the Times Higher Global Rankings (801-1000) and has previously held the coveted UK University of the Year title, awarded by Times Higher Education in 2014/2015.



Other recent successes include a Global Teaching Excellence Spotlight Award (2018) from Advance HE in association with Times Higher Education, being ranked in the top 10 for teaching by the Times/Sunday Times Good University Guide 2017, top in the North West for student experience (Time Higher Education 2017), and top in the UK for student accommodation in the 2017 WhatUni Awards.

Edge Hill University has achieved both Athena Swan Bronze and the European Commission's 'HR Excellence in Research Award' (first awarded 2018 and reawarded 2021), which acknowledges alignment with the principles of the European Charter for Researchers and Code of Conduct for researcher recruitment. The process incorporates both the QAA Code of Practice for Research Degree Programmes and the Concordat to Support the Career Development of Researchers.



Duties and Responsibilities

The duties and responsibilities of this post are as follows. The postholder will be expected to carry out the following as and when required.

- Work with a designated Director of Studies and supervisory team to develop the research project into one suitable for registration for PhD at the University.
- 2. Undertake a supervised programme of research with the aim of completion by the end of the contract.
- 3. Support student learning including preparation and delivery of taught sessions (or external work-based placements, practical's, seminars and clinical practice as appropriate) as a member of a team within an established programme under the guidance of an allocated mentor (based on an average of 6 hours of teaching, and 9 hours marking and preparation, per week across the teaching year)
- 4. Monitor student progress against agreed criteria and intervene appropriately to support student learning, including marking student work (using marking schemes prepared by a permanent member of the teaching staff)
- 5. Perform administrative tasks directly related to the teaching role, including the maintenance of attendance lists and the submission of mark sheets by agreed deadline dates.
- 6. Seek opportunities to give conference papers, present posters and submit articles to recognised academic media, based on the programme of research
- 7. Communicate effectively and using appropriate media to a range of internal and external groups including students, colleagues, supervisors and researchers
- 8. Contribute effectively to the maintenance and continued development of teaching and research at Edge Hill University
- 9. Use initiative to deal with day-to-day issues using professional judgement regarding particular situations and refer problems as appropriate
- 10. Plan own day-to-day activity within a framework of agreed activity, coordinating own work with that of others to ensure effective achievement of targets
- 11. Be aware of risks in the work environment and the influence upon others, always working within scopes of practice and adhering to the relevant ethical guidelines and codes of conduct



- 12. Possess sufficient breadth and depth of knowledge to be able to contribute to the relevant programme(s) and engage in staff development to support the role
- 13. To abide by the University Research Code of Practice and the University Framework for Research Ethics (available via the Research wiki)
- 14. Carry out any other duties deemed commensurate with the post

Eligibility

Candidates should have a good undergraduate honours degree level (2:1 or above) and/or a Masters level qualifications in a relevant subject area.1

Although it is possible for candidates to apply for the GTA scheme more than once, candidates who have applied unsuccessfully on two or more occasions are unlikely to be shortlisted for interview.

Candidates should only apply for one opportunity at one time. Applications submitted across multiple research areas will not be accepted.

You will be registered on your research degree as a full-time² postgraduate researcher. Due to teaching duties occurring alongside your studies, it is normally the case that successful candidates discontinue any other employment during their registration. You will be unable to undertake additional paid employment for Edge Hill University during your period as a Graduate Teaching Assistant.

International and EU candidates who require a visa to study in the UK will need to demonstrate that they meet the requirements for the relevant visa and possess appropriate English Language level demonstrated through an IELTS overall score of 7.0 with no element below 6.5 or equivalent. Evidence of English Language level must be provided at application to be considered. Further guidance can be found here. Please be advised that letters of

¹ Please note that candidates with a master's level qualification, but not an undergraduate honours degree (2:1 or above) supersede the minimum entry requirement. Candidates in this case are eligible to apply.

² Full-time PhD PGRs are expected to dedicate 35 hours, per week, to their research. PhD PGRs, who are also GTAs, are required to undertake 6 hours teaching and 9 hours marking/preparing per week on top of this time dedicated to research.



recommendation, and requests to waive language entry requirements, will not be accepted.

Applications are not normally accepted from candidates who already possess a PhD in the same, or related, subject area, unless there are compelling reasons for doing so. If a PhD has been obtained in the UK as a Tier 4 (General) Student Visa holder, further sponsorship cannot be offered under the Tier 4 (General) Student Visa category, as this will not meet the academic progression requirements set by the UKVI.

Candidates should note that shortlisting will be based on information provided on the application form with regard to the applicant's ability to meet the criteria outlined in the Person Specification attached.

It is important to note that you may be required to undertake an enhanced disclosure from the Disclosure and Barring Service, either during pre-employment clearance for this role or following employment depending upon your Graduate Teaching Assistant duties in your subject area – as applicable this would form part of the conditions of offer of employment.

- The quality of the research proposal
- The synergy between your qualifications, research experience and declared research interest
- Your curriculum vitae

- Supervisory capacity in the declared area of research
- Previous tutoring/teaching experience and related subject based qualifications
- The strategic and developmental needs of the University

You will also be asked to complete onboarding forms including a pre-employment health questionnaire to support the University make appropriate adjustments to support you in the role.
